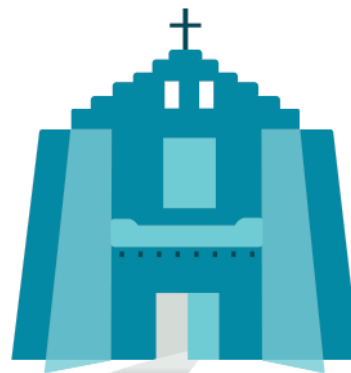

Parking Options this summer:

- A few spaces in the church garage are available during the day and lots of space evenings and weekends.
