## MISSION AND SOCIAL JUSTICE

**Fridays with First at the Shelter:** Come join us Fridays at the Interfaith Community Shelter, 2801 Cerrillos Road, preparing lunch for our homeless neighbors. From 8:30 to 10:30 help prep the food and from 10:30 to 12:30 serve the guests.

The Interfaith Community Shelter is holding its annual **Chefscapades Benefit Dinner** on September 6. The major fundraiser for the homeless shelter will be held at 6:00PM at Las Campanas Clubhouse. Tickets are \$150 each with \$125 tax deductible.
