This Land Is My Land. This Land Is Your Land???

Part I of the environmental justice and racism class will focus on the narrative and topic of land, water and wildlife in America. Together we will explore how various ethics rooted in colonialism, rugged individualism, urbanism, gender roles and utilitarianism shaped much of the dominant culture's policies and behaviors toward our nation's land, water, and wildlife. We will compare and contrast this against early Native American perspectives as well as communal approaches to land use that existed in the early American west. We will explore how all of this shaped the early American environmental movement as well as how early wars over land, water and wildlife are now being repeated today in different forms and iterations. Finally, we will conclude with a discussion about what does all this mean for us as Christians and Presbyterians to be good stewards of God's creation and to act as EarthKeepers.

To better understand the various perspectives that have shaped our land use policies and the early environmental movement.
